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UNIVERSITY OF CONNECTICUT METRICS

The goal of the University of Connecticut is to be among the best public universities in the United States. UConn has made significant advances in recent years in its national rankings; it continues to be acknowledged as the best public university in New England and is among the top 25 in the nation according to *U.S. News & World Report*. A selected set of metrics were developed in 2004 to focus our institutional review efforts and to compare ourselves to nationally recognized public research universities. These metrics allow us to evaluate our progress longitudinally and to compare how we are doing vis-à-vis institutions like those we aspire to be. The performance measures are included in institutional and academic planning.

The metrics were established with a number of rankings of institutions that exist at the national level. These include U.S. News & World Report (especially undergraduate, but also selected graduate programs), National Research Council (for research programs), and The Center for Measuring University Performance. Each of these rankings has certain limitations. Some national sources of rankings include UConn's Health Center as well as its Regional Campuses; other sources are restricted to the Storrs Campus. Almost one-fourth of the U.S. News & World Report rating is based on a qualitative "perception" of the institution by the leaders of other institutions. At present the NRC does not rank all graduate programs and produces its rankings only once a decade. The rankings by The Center are skewed in favor of larger institutions. These issues need to be considered when comparing institutions of varying size; especially given that in terms of size, the University of Connecticut is one of the smaller Carnegie Research Universities with Very High Research Activity. While the wellknown rankings continue to be useful, especially in comparisons to other research universities, we are in the process of developing an expanded set of metrics that recognizes. encourages and rewards performance in various areas of productivity and is responsive to the University's Academic Plan.

Our current peer group of institutions includes Georgia, Iowa, Iowa State, Ohio State, Purdue, Minnesota, Missouri, and Rutgers. We believe that these institutions define a standard of excellence and quality that UConn can attain by focusing its efforts in areas that enhance scholarly productivity and educational programs for its undergraduate, graduate and professional students.

The metrics are grouped into five categories. These include:

- Undergraduate Education
- Research & Graduate/Professional Education
- > Diversity
- Resources
- National Reputation

To the extent the data becomes available, the metrics will be available for each school and college and each regional campus within the University. Further details within the major units also are being generated for academic planning and decision-making.

The Center for Continuing Studies, previously included in the metrics, has been reorganized within the Center for Excellence in Teaching and Learning and redirected toward the eCampus initiatives of the University. Metrics are being developed for the more inclusive Center for Excellence.
