### SUBJECT: APPROVAL OF THE SPENDING PLAN FOR FISCAL YEAR 2007

### **RECOMMENDATION:**

That the Board of Trustees approve a Spending Plan for Fiscal Year 2007 of \$858.1 million.

### **BACKGROUND:**

The Fiscal Year 2007 Spending Plan includes \$856.7 million of revenue, including state funding of \$220.6 (excluding fringe benefits), to cover \$858.1 million in expenses, yielding a \$1.4 million net loss. This net loss is comprised of a \$1.0 million gain representing the reserve repayment for the November 2001 drawdown of \$11.5 million for the Towers Dining Center and Student Union and a \$2.4 million loss in Auxiliary Enterprises due to increased energy costs.

- SUBJECT: Approval of the Spending Plan for the University of Connecticut Health Center for Fiscal Year 2007.

### **RECOMMENDATION:**

That the Board of Trustees approves the University of Connecticut Health Center Spending Plan for the Fiscal Year 2007.

### **BACKGROUND:**

The Fiscal Year 2007 Spending Plan for the Health Center includes \$ 654.8 million of revenue, including a state appropriation of \$76.9 million, to cover \$654.7 million in expenses, yielding a net gain of \$94,101. This budget includes planned revenue enhancements and expenditure reductions, which will be implemented during Fiscal Year 2007 to provide funding for strategic initiatives as discussed at the Board of Directors meeting on June 12, 2006.

SUBJECT: Approval of the Capital Spending Plan for Fiscal Year 2007 and the Five Year Capital Spending Plan for Fiscal Years 2008-2012 for the University of Connecticut Health Center.

### **<u>RECOMMENDATION</u>**:

That the Board of Trustees approves the University of Connecticut Health Center Capital Spending Plan for Fiscal Year 2007 and the Five Year Capital Spending Plan for Fiscal Years 2008-2012.

### **BACKGROUND**:

The Capital Spending Plan for FY 2007 for the Health Center provides for State Bond Fund expenditures totaling \$2,855,305, UCONN 2000 Phase III (21<sup>st</sup> Century UConn) Bonds totaling \$23,510,425 and \$50,950,000 from other funds that include Research Use Allowance, John Dempsey Hospital, UConn Medical Group and others.

The Five-Year Capital Spending Plan reflects the planned use of UCONN 2000 Phase III (21<sup>st</sup> Century UConn) Bond Funds, other non-bond fund sources, and anticipated future capital funding needs through 2012.
