RE: Fall 2020-Spring 2025 Tuition Plan for University of Connecticut, Storrs and

Regional Campuses

RECOMMENDATION:

The Administration recommends that the Board of Trustees approve the attached Five-Year Tuition Plan for Fiscal Years 2021 – 2025, which will apply to all undergraduate and graduate tuition-based programs excluding School of Law.

This plan develops the proposed increases based on a number of factors. First, it starts with prior year's tuition and adds inflation. Second, it adjusts based on how state fiscal actions impact the University, including, but not limited to, direct state funding, indirect state funding such as fringe benefit reimbursement, unfunded mandates, and labor agreements agreed to, but not funded by the state. Finally, it adds \$100 to support improvements that maintain institutional excellence.

Also, the Administration recommends setting tuition for scholarship and waiver programs, including but not limited to, teaching assistants, research assistants, resident assistants, employees and dependents, athletes, veterans, and senior citizens, at the in-state tuition rate.

RESOLUTION:

"Be it resolved that the University's tuition for Fiscal Years 2021 - 2025 shall be set according to the attached Five-Year Tuition Plan and Rate Schedule, provided that in the event of a change in state support, the Administration shall propose a revised schedule to the Board of Trustees, and that the tuition rate for scholarship and waiver programs shall be set at the in-state tuition rate."

BACKGROUND:

In setting tuition, UConn seeks to balance the need for financial resources sufficient to continue to provide high quality educational experiences for our students, with our public mission to remain accessible and affordable to Connecticut residents.

In this plan, we propose to set tuition following a methodology that takes into account several factors: 1) inflation, based on the Higher Education Price Index (HEPI), 2) changes in state support for the University, such as the level of block grant funding, fringe benefit reimbursement and expense, and other mandated changes, and 3) a flat \$100 annual increase to support improvements that maintain institutional excellence.

Following this formula, based on our current level of state funding and a HEPI rate of 2.8%, we project tuition increases as follows, over the next five years:

On an annual basis, these increases are the lowest in four years. By comparison, our last four-year plan raised in-state tuition from \$700 to \$950, and out-of-state tuition \$950 to \$1,250 every year.

Furthermore, the multi-year planning approach is meant to facilitate planning for students and their families. However, given the average time to degree of 4.2 years, some students graduate in five years, and previously, if a freshmen began in the third year of the four-year plan, they would only know what their tuition would be for two years. Thus, the Administration recommends a five-year planning approach, and intends to update the fifth year of the five-year plan each year to provide each new cohort of freshmen with a full view of the tuition they will face until graduation.

Revenue collected from the increased tuition will help UConn compensate for level state funding in the face of rising costs, particularly contractually mandated personnel costs. Since FY16, the State block grant has been cut \$40 million and is currently at the 2005 rate. In addition, contractual salary increases and higher fringe rates have continued to drive University expenses. In FY21, the first year of the proposed plan, mandated salary increases and related fringe benefits are estimated to increase personnel costs by \$36.9 million. As tuition increases alone will not completely offset these additional operating costs, the University will continue to work towards reducing costs and growing other non-tuition revenues. Cost-cutting measures will likely include hiring restrictions and workforce reductions. This will be done in a careful and strategic manner to align to our mission and protect our academic quality.

As the University increases tuition, additional financial aid funds will be set aside to assist students and families in need. UConn continues to invest significantly in financial aid in order to keep the University affordable and accessible. The current year's budget has about \$123.4 million set aside to fund institutional aid that students do not have to repay, a 26% increase over the last three years. Under the proposal, institutional aid would increase \$6.6 million to \$130.0 in FY21.

Protecting Academic Quality

UConn has improved dramatically over the last generation, including reduced time to graduation and increased educational quality

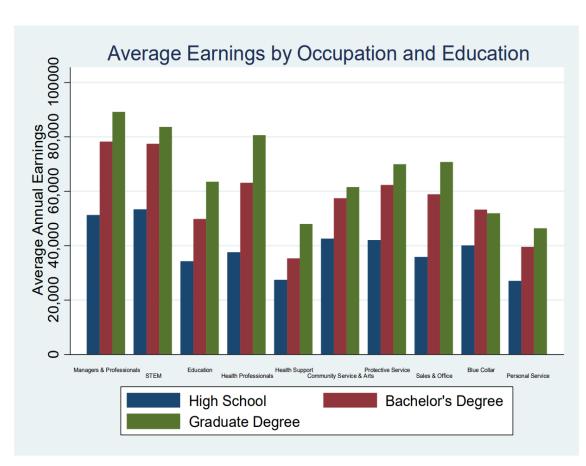
- Top 25 Public National University (24th) in U.S. News and World Report
- Highest ever average mean SAT score
- 37% of undergraduate students from diverse backgrounds
- Decreased average time to degree to 4.2 years
- 32% increase in STEM Bachelor's degrees (since FY13)
- Reduced class size throughout general education and science courses
- Increased academic quality of students



Returns to College Education

Even as costs are rising, a college degree is a great investment

- A college education delivers financial returns that exceed most Wall Street investments
- The Center on Education and the Workforce at Georgetown University estimated that those with bachelor degrees earn 75% more, on average, than those with only high school education
- Ashenfelter and Krueger (1994)
 estimated that each year of
 schooling increases wages by 12%
 to 16%

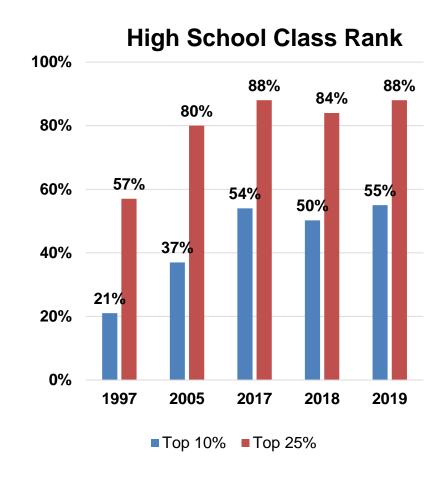

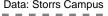
The increasing quality of our Freshman class is very strong, with average SAT scores ranking in the 90th percentile nationally.

The class rank of entering Freshmen continues to be competitive, with more than half being in the top 10% of graduating high school classes



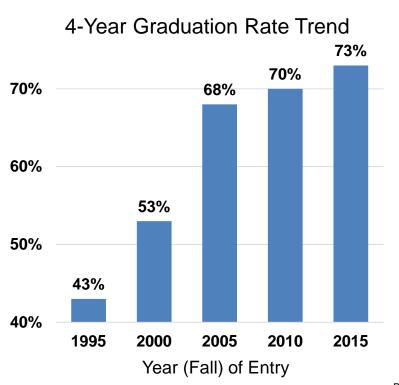


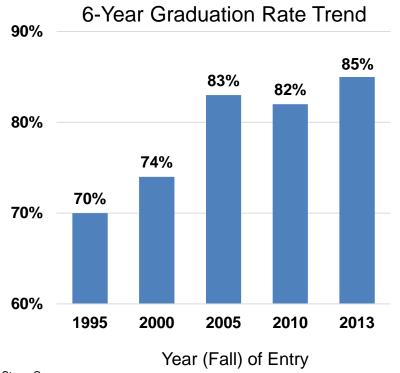


UConn Student Success

Economic Uncertainty

State block grant uncertainty creates budget pressure

The State Block Grant, which funds 47% of employee salaries, has averaged ~\$214M per year since FY10. The FY19 budgeted Block Grant is ~\$14M less than the 10-year average

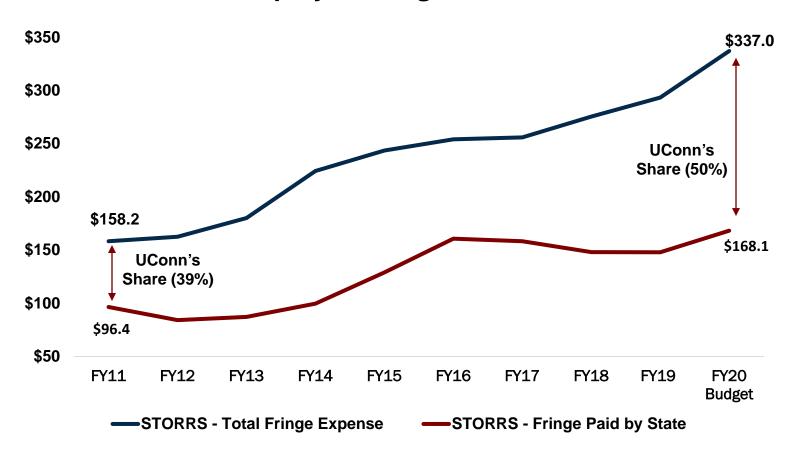
The remaining 53% of employees are funded by non-State revenue sources including tuition and fees, auxiliary enterprises, research, grants and contracts, foundation, and sales and services

The Largest Increase in Cost for UConn is State Employee Fringe Benefits

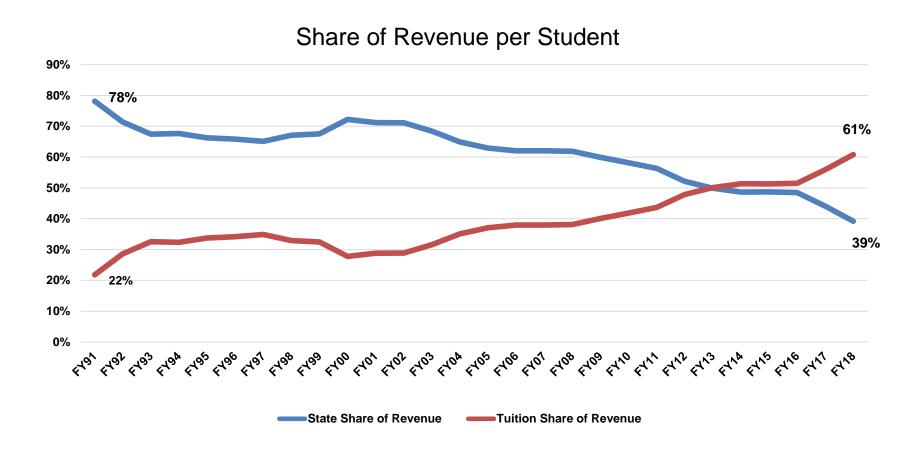


Fringe rates are determined by the State Comptroller's Office. UConn has no input or control over these rates.

Addressing the Budget Gap

UConn continues to cut costs, not relying only on tuition increases

- Closed Torrington Campus
- 100 layoffs at the end of FY16
- 3%-5% annual cuts to academic departments in each of the last 4 years
- Merged UConn and UConn Health Fire and Police Departments to save \$1M in FY18 by reducing overtime, reducing FTE count, consolidating leadership, changes in service delivery, etc.
- Through a program called Spend Smart, over 200 initiatives were implemented by over 37 departments, schools/colleges and units totaling nearly \$29M in savings.
- Centralized regional campus leadership, enrollment management, financial controls, HR, procurement, software systems and student services to Storrs.
- Continually identifying expense reductions, revenue enhancements, cost avoidance and operational efficiencies
- Coordination, collaboration and consolidation between UConn and UConn Health ongoing

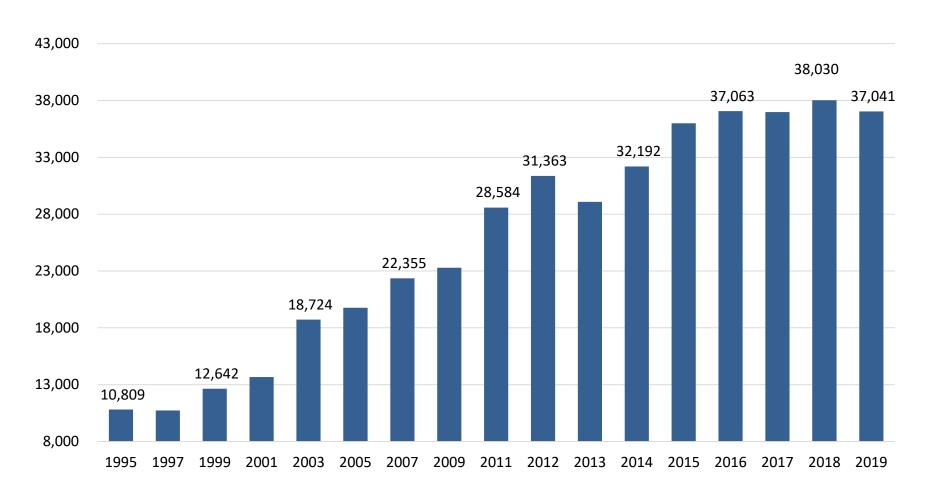

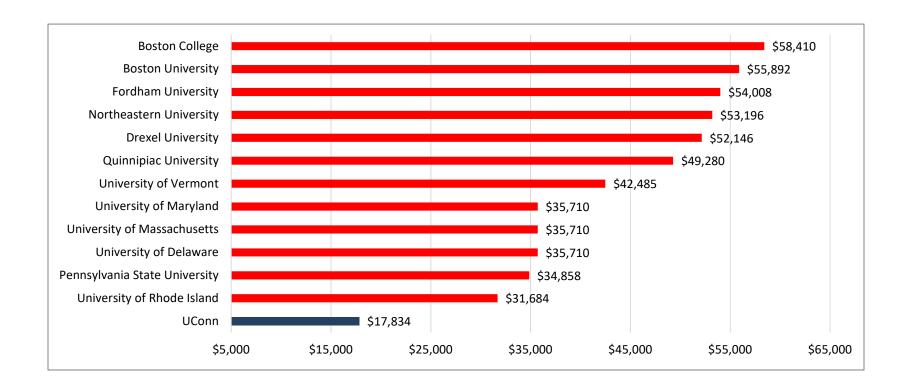
