


Total Student Enrollment - Fall 1995-2006












University of Connecticut (Storrs & Regional Campuses) Freshman Enrollment - Fall 1995-2006


- *First semester Freshman enrollment increased by 63% from Fall 1995 to Fall 2006.

Comparison of Connecticut public high school minority graduation rates to UConn freshman enrollment. Please note: in 2004, according to the CT Department of Education, 81.6% of all public high school graduates continued their education after high school, with 57.4% going to 4 year colleges, 20.4% going to 2 year colleges and 3.8% continuing with some other form of education.
