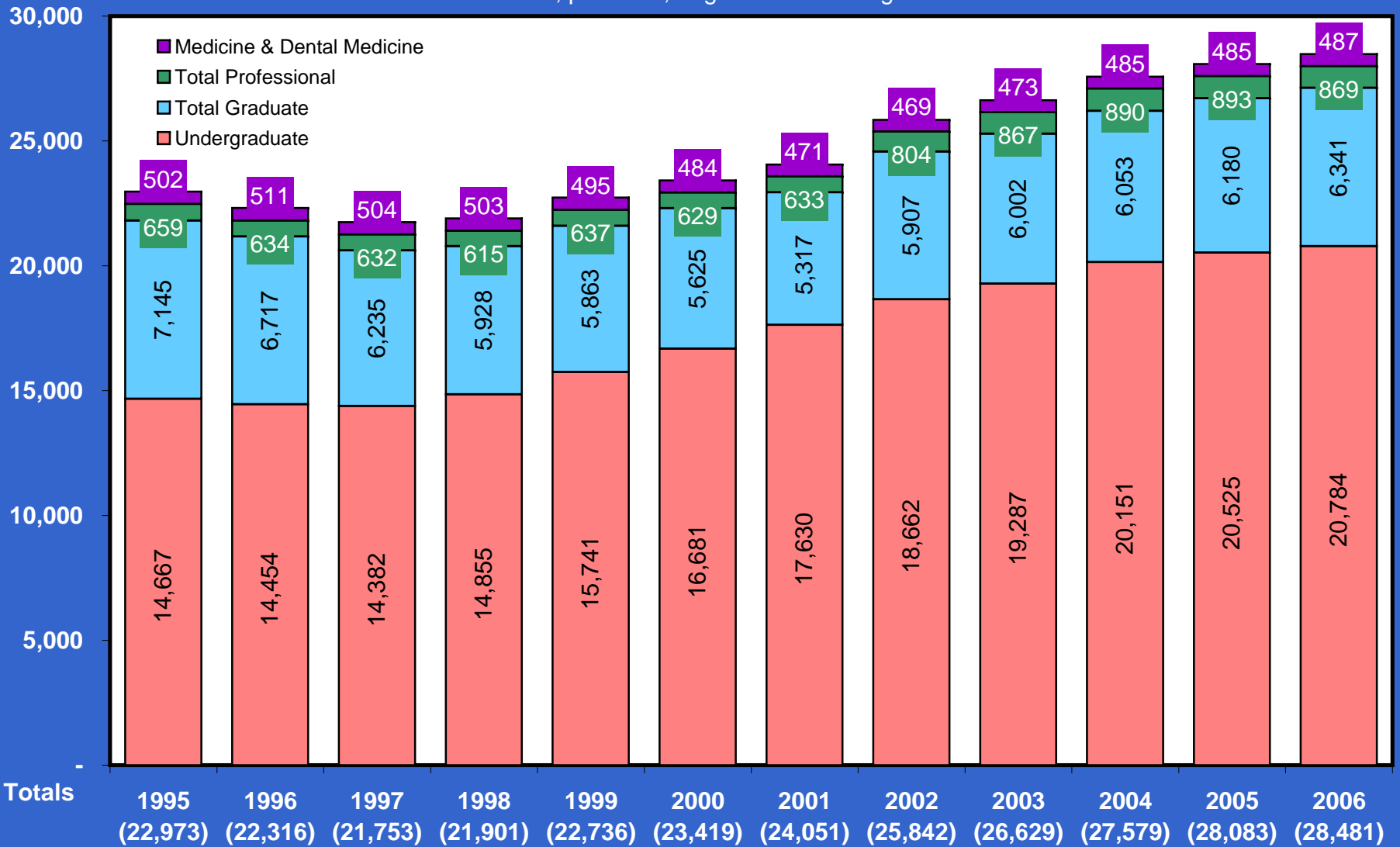

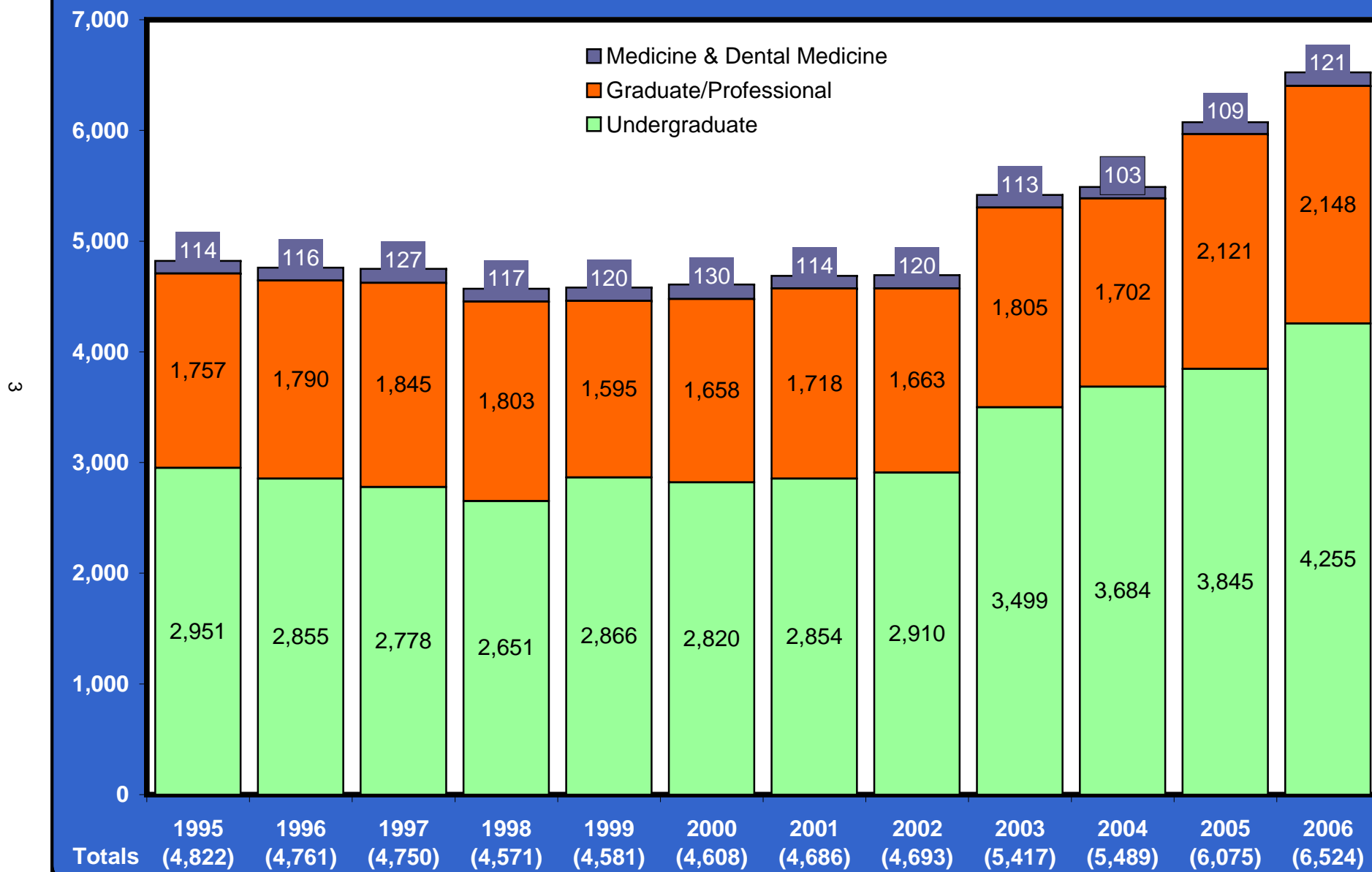

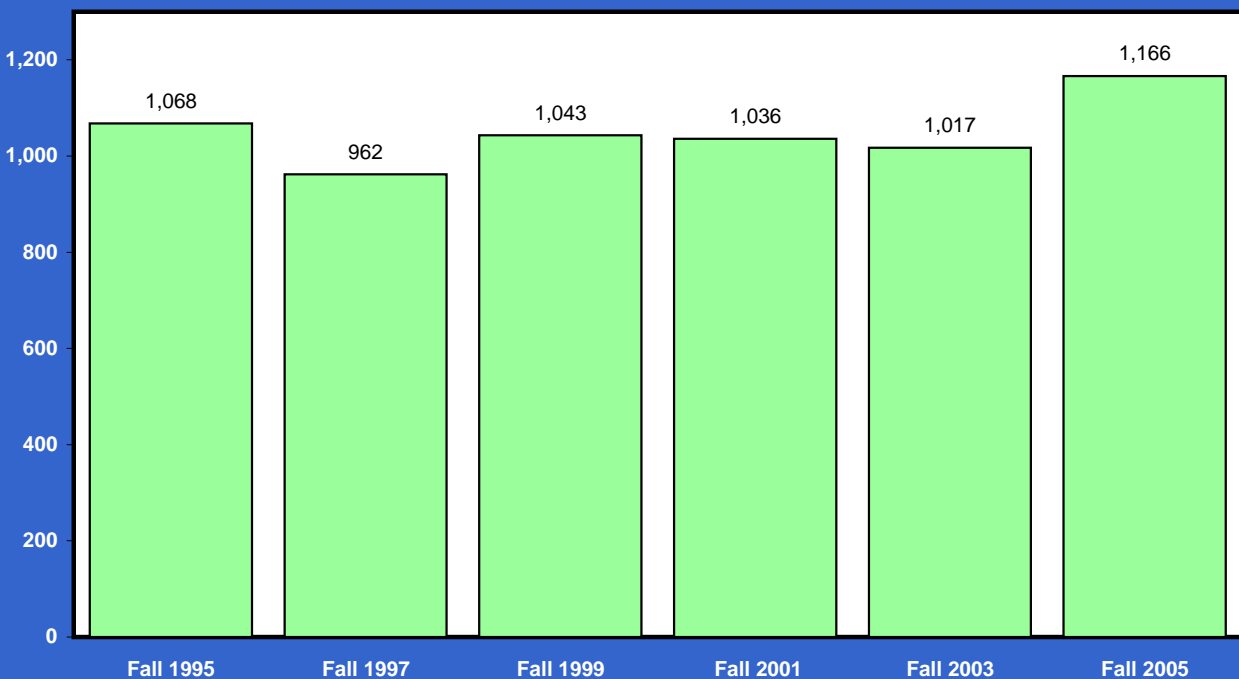

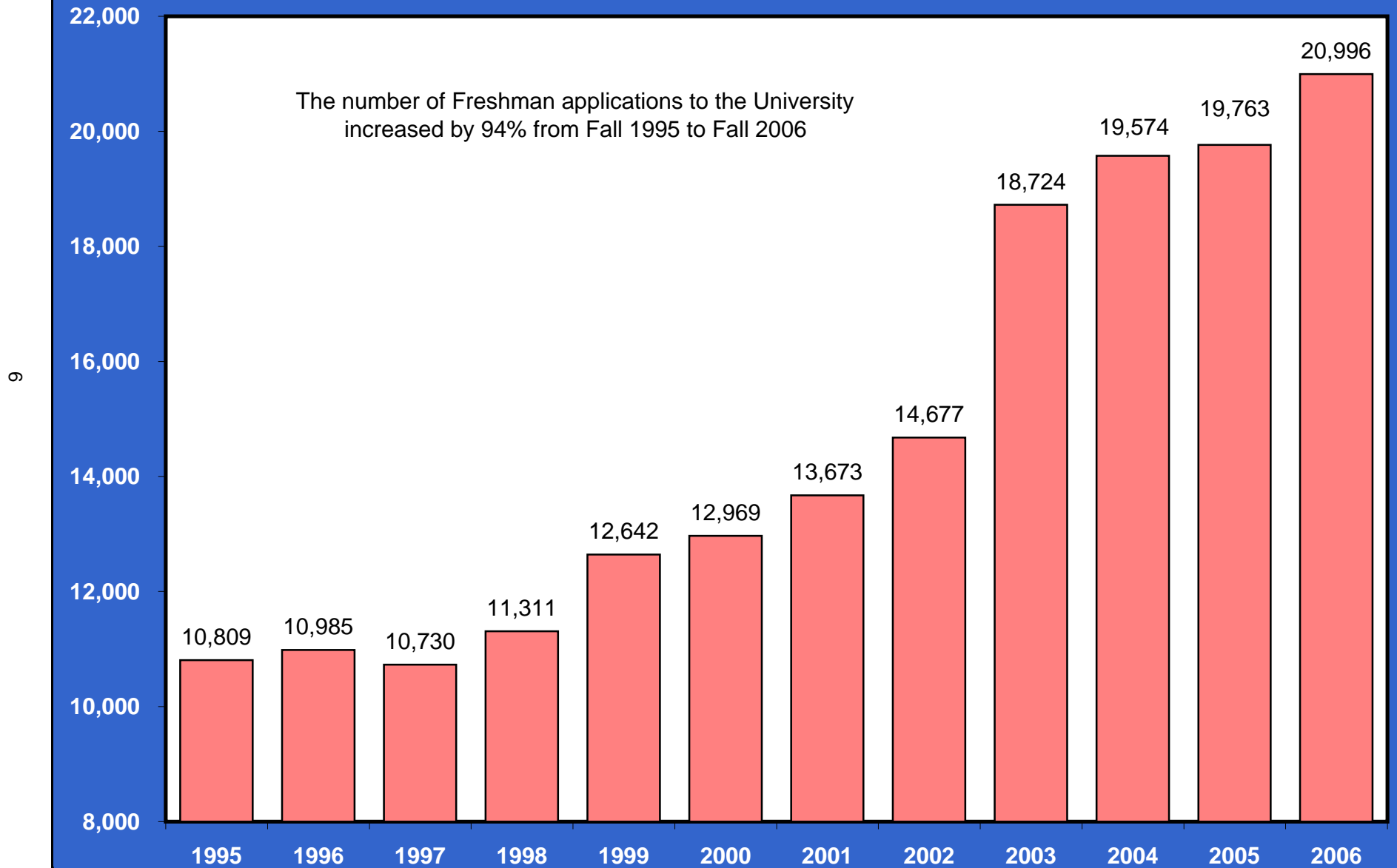

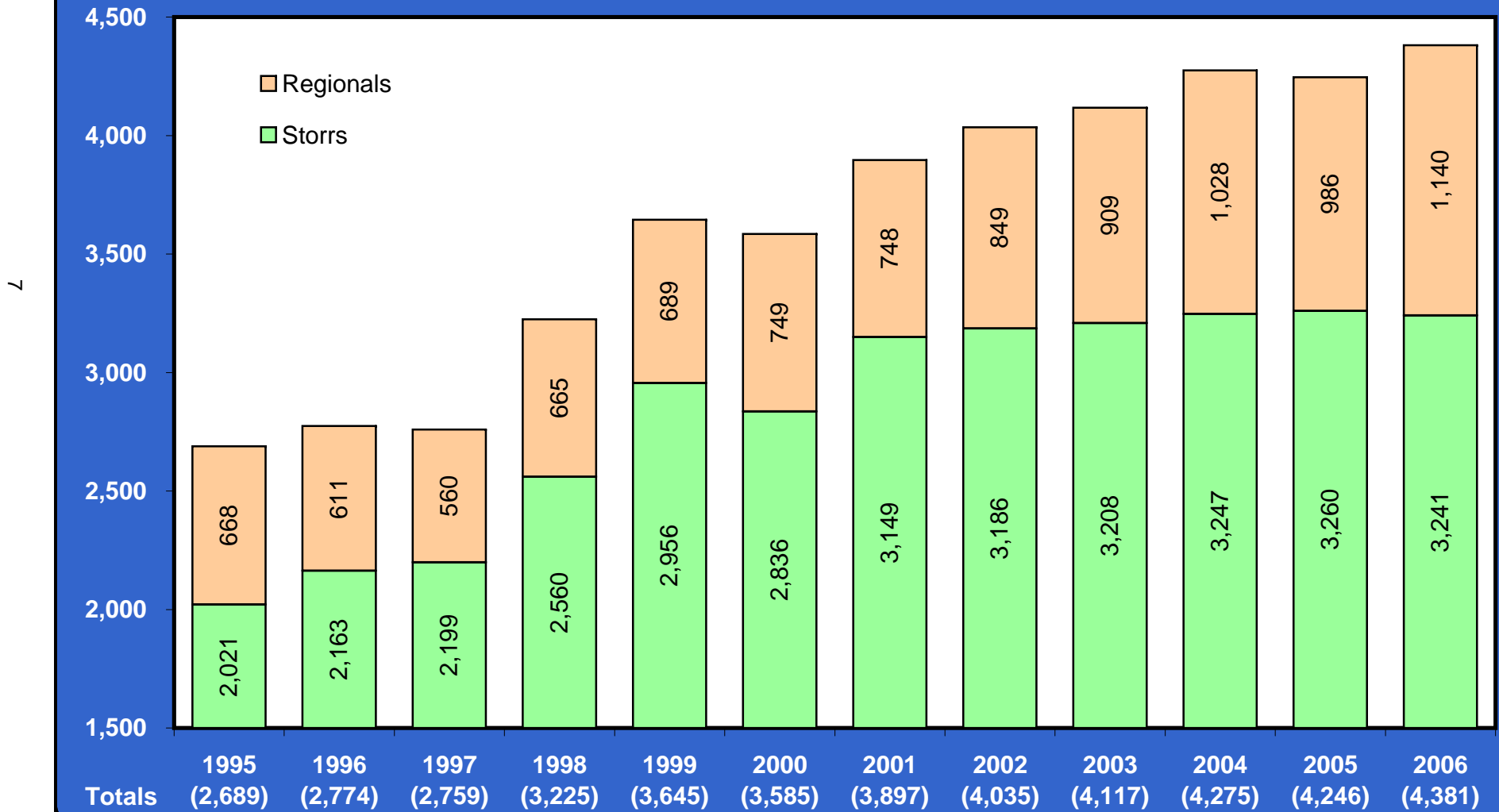
Freshman Applications for Entry Fall 1995-2006

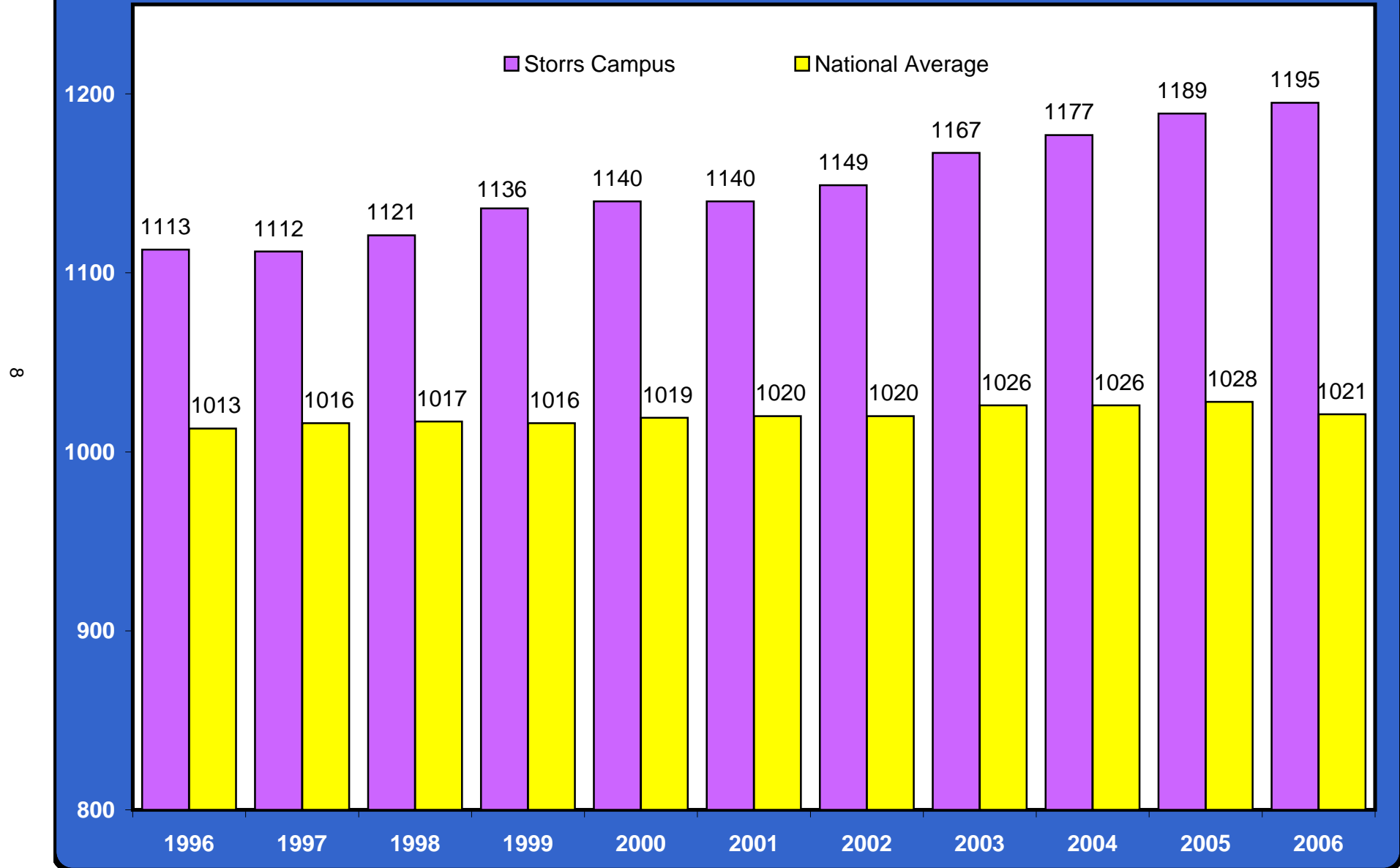
Freshman Enrollment - Fall 1995-2006

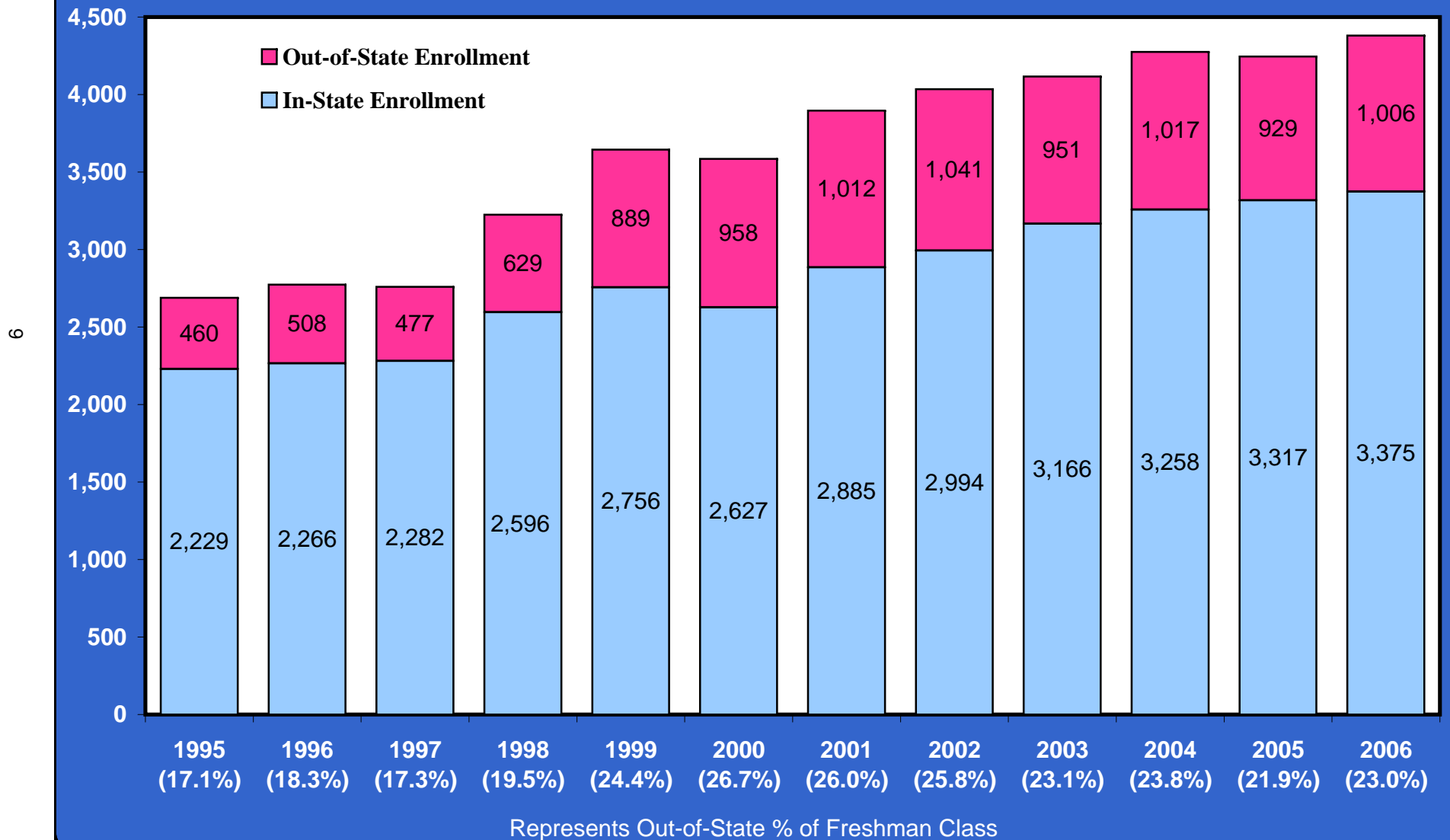
Average Total SAT Scores - Fall 1996-2006

Freshman In-State and Out-of-State Enrollment - Fall 1995-2006

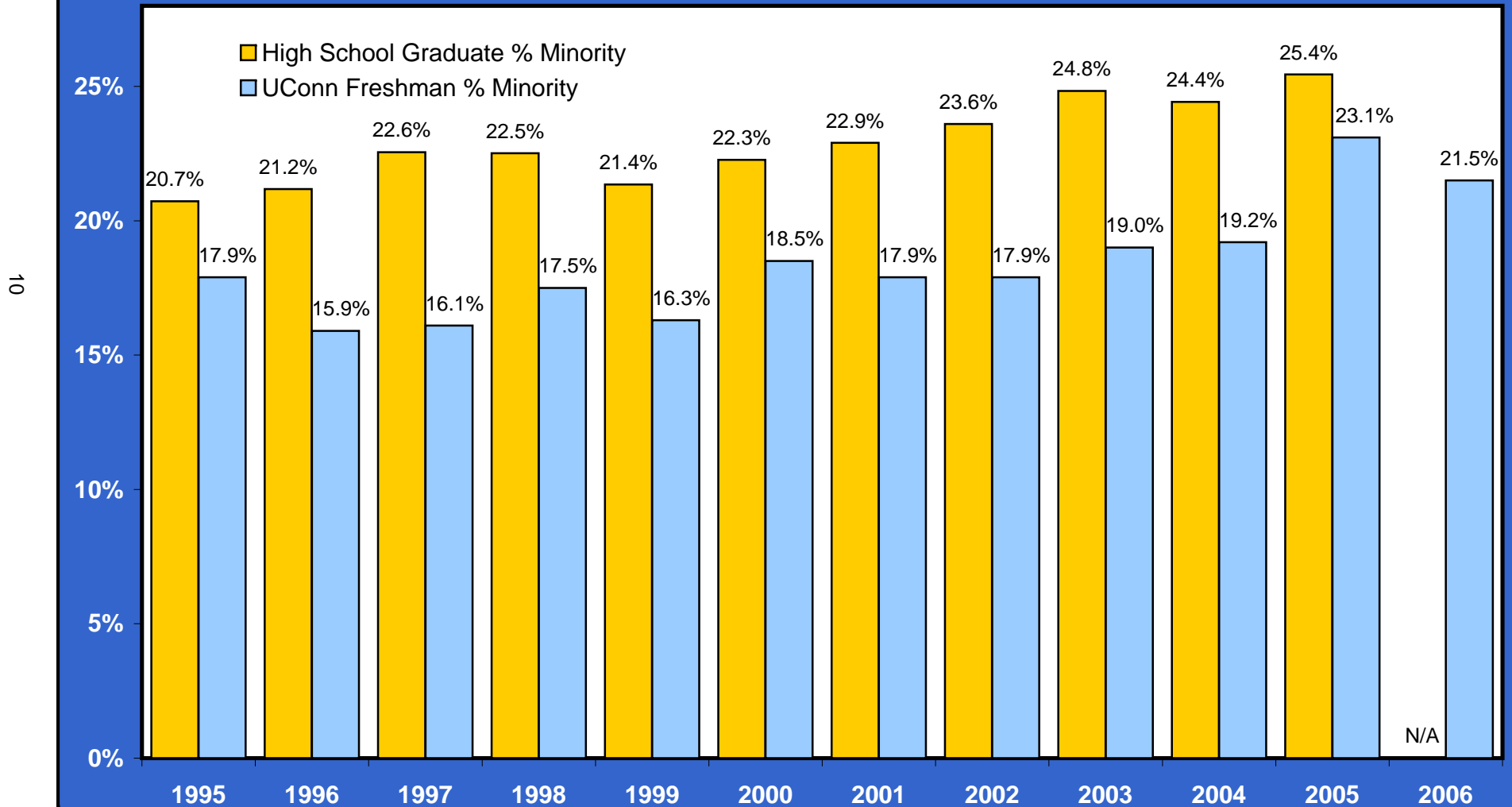

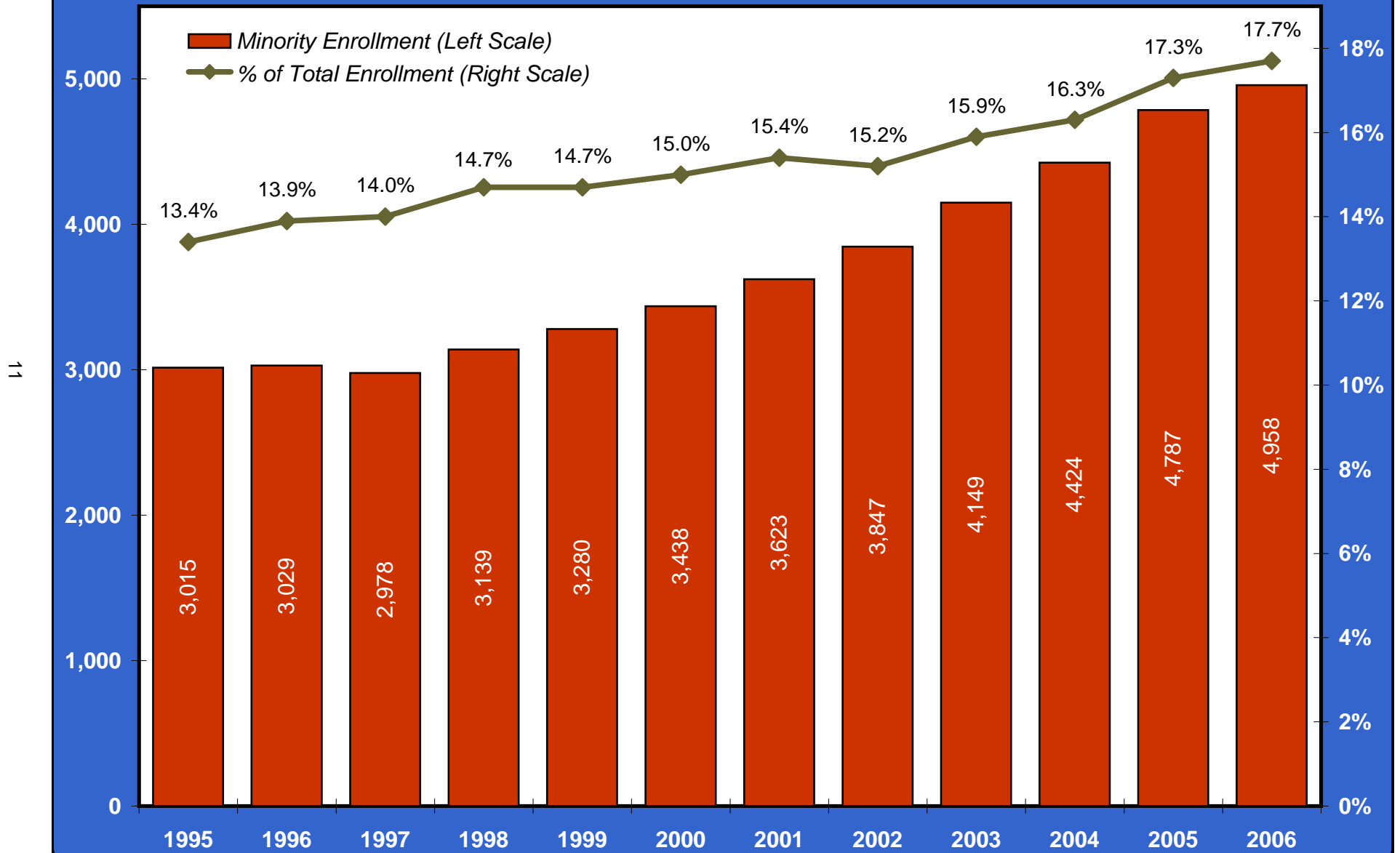
Freshman Minority Enrollment Trends for Entry Fall 1995-2006

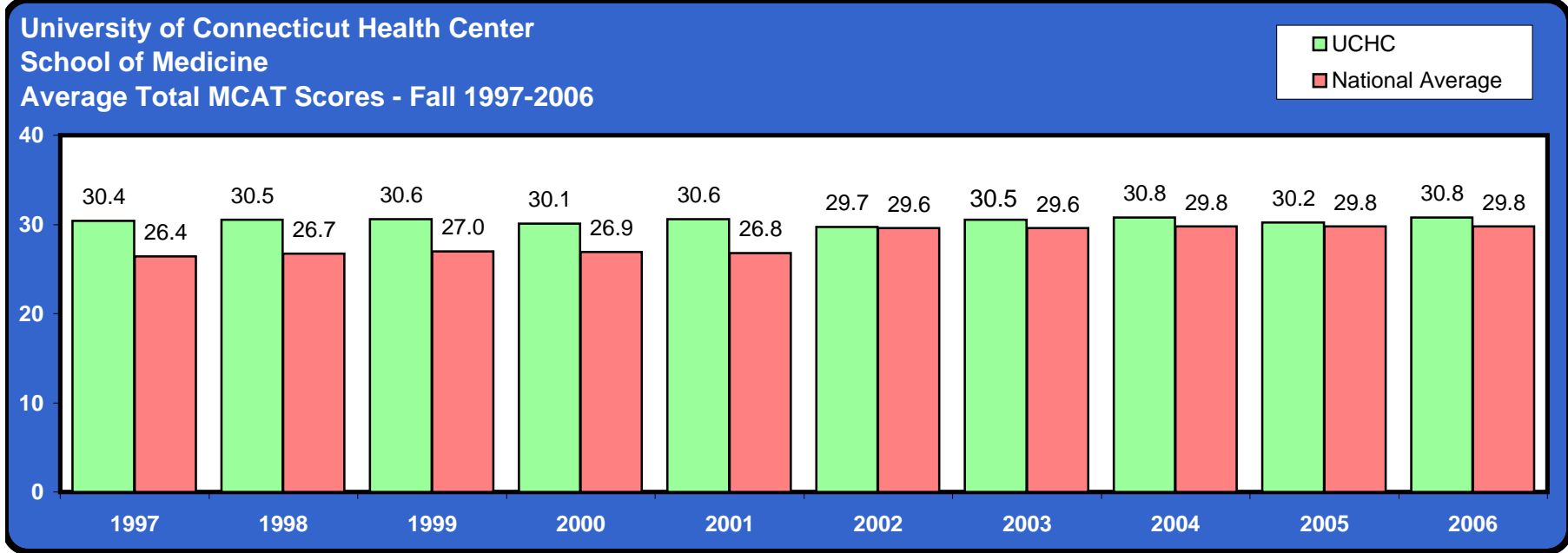
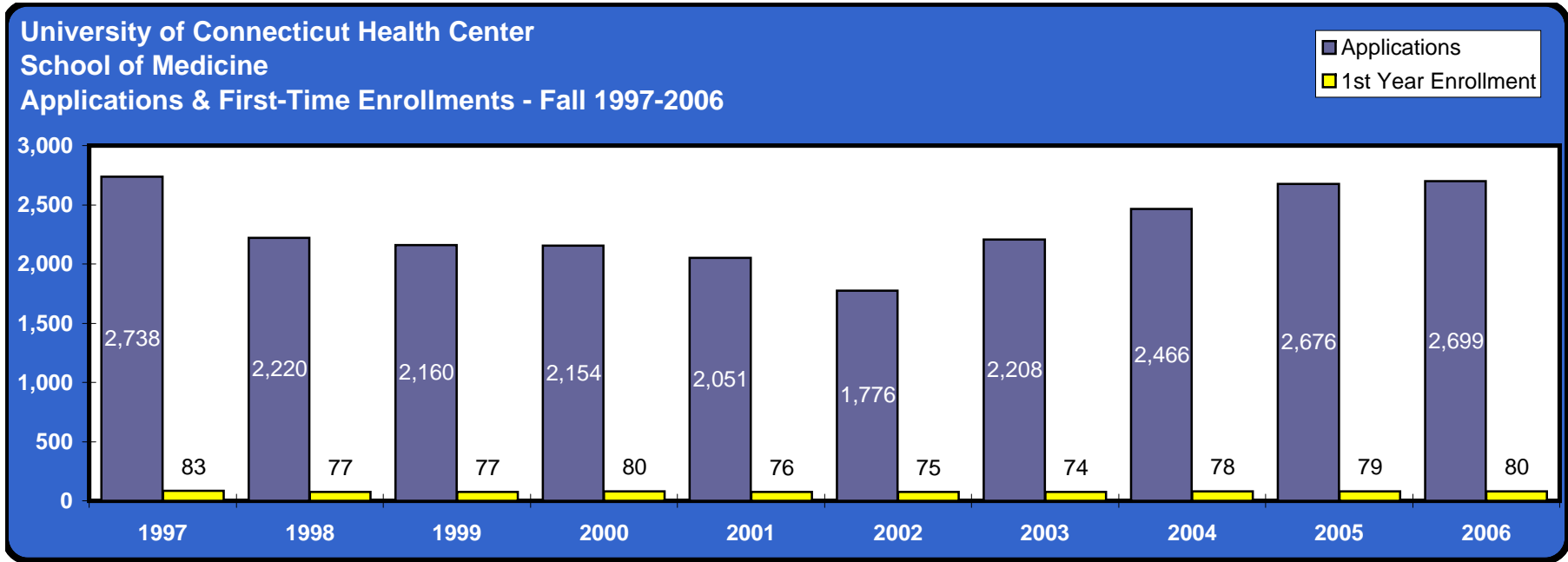

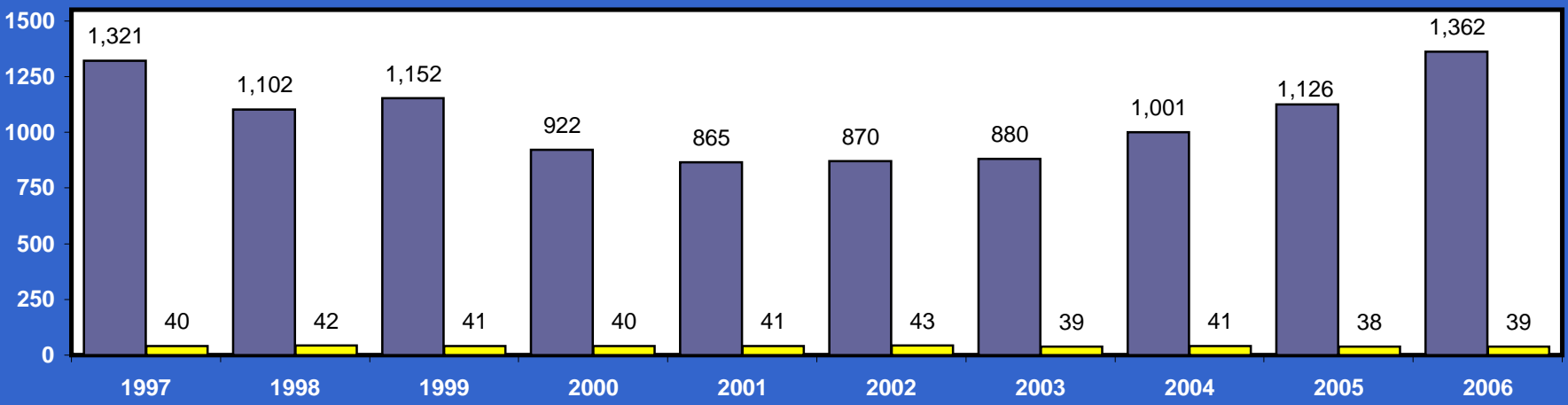
Total Minority Enrollment - Fall 1995-2006





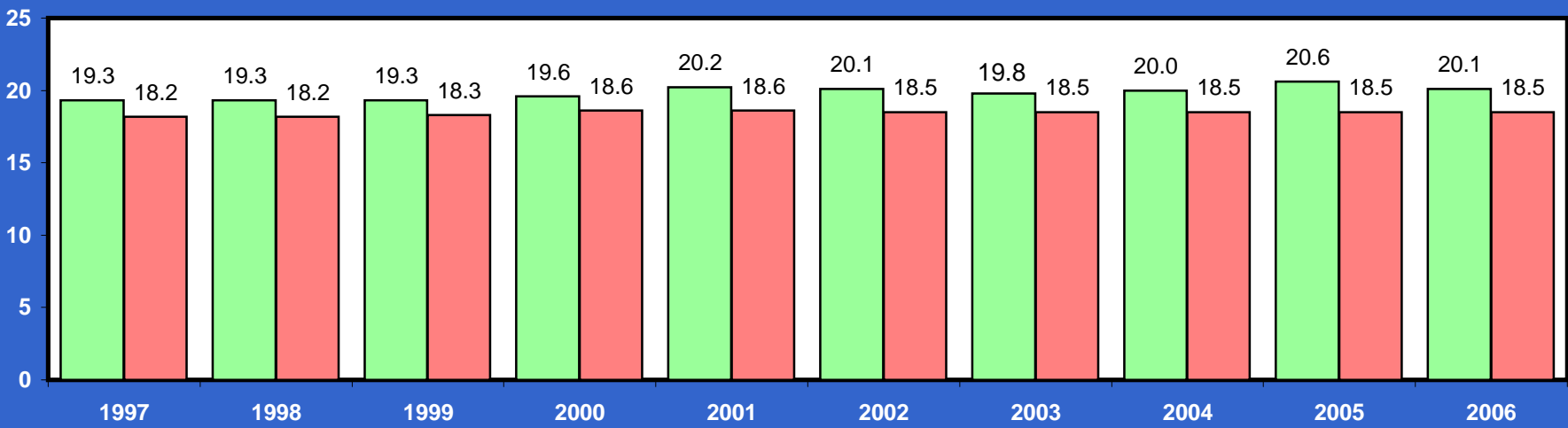

 Average Total DAT Scores - Fall 1997-2006

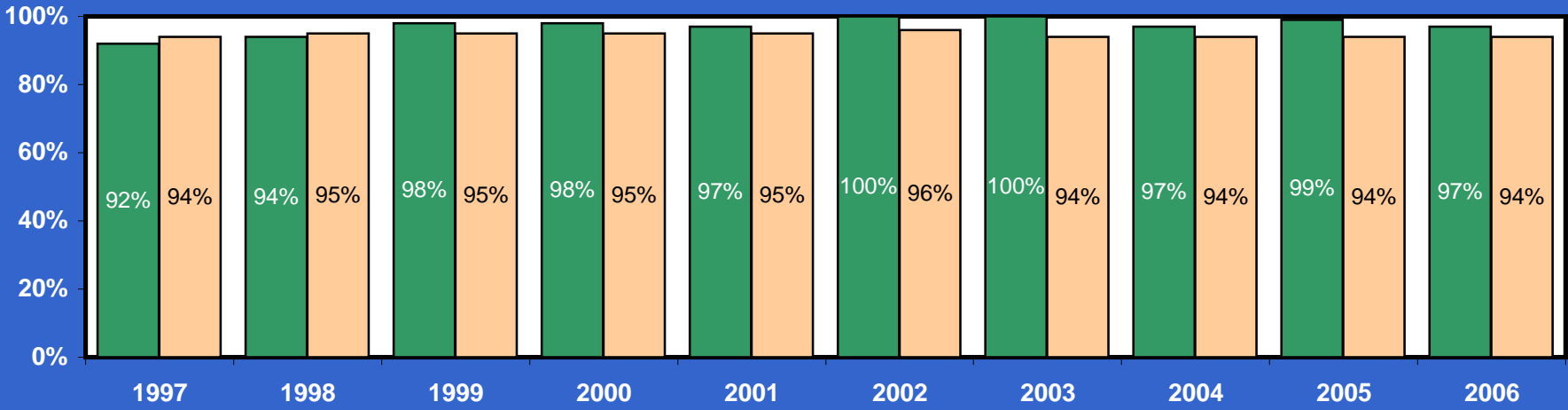

Student Passing Rates on National Medicine Exam -Spring 1997-2006

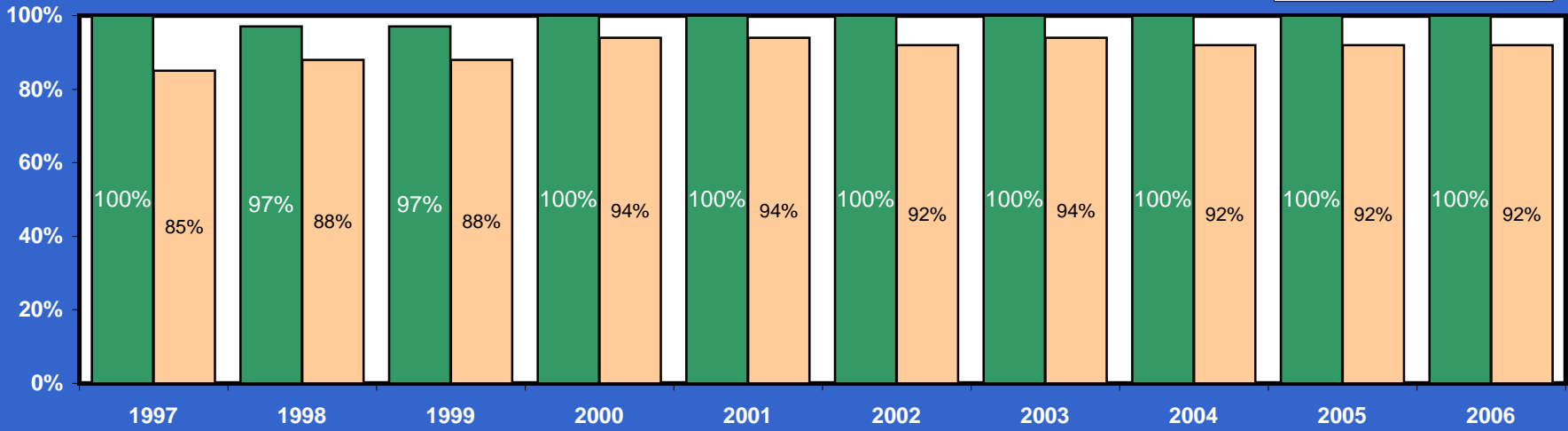
