

University of Connecticut - Storrs & Regional Campuses Freshman Applications for Entry Fall 1995-2013




University of Connecticut - Storrs & Regional Campuses Freshman Enrollment - Fall 1995-2013






University of Connecticut - Storrs Only Average Total SAT Scores - Fall 1997-2013





University of Connecticut - Storrs & Regional Campuses Freshman In-State and Out-of-State Enrollment - Fall 1995-2013






University of Connecticut - Storrs & Regional Campuses Freshman Minority Enrollment Trends for Entry Fall 1995-2013







University of Connecticut - Storrs & Regional Campuses Total Minority Enrollment - Fall 1995-2013












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UConn Health Schools of Medicine and Dental Medicine Total Minority Enrollment - Fall 1997-2013
